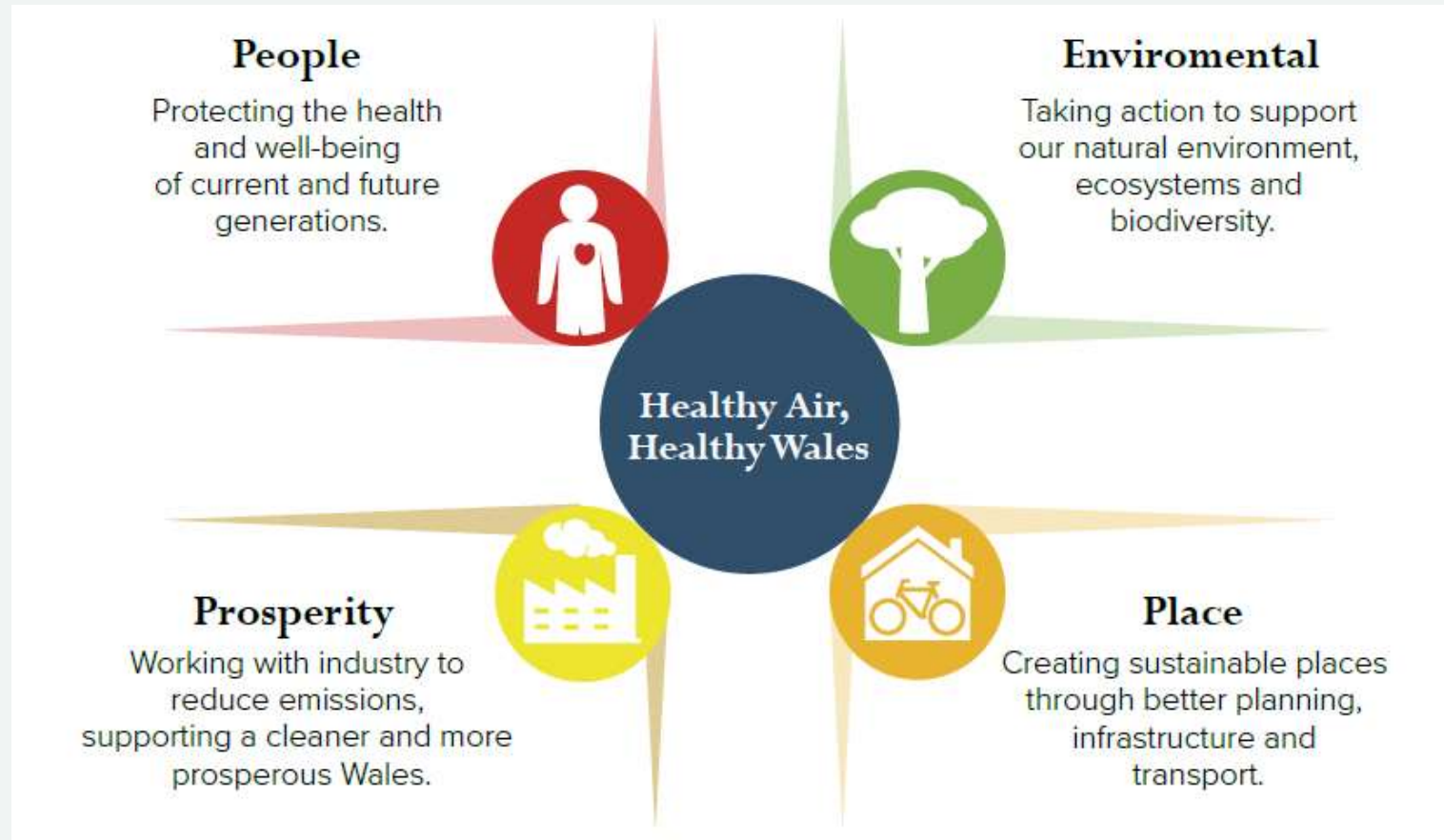

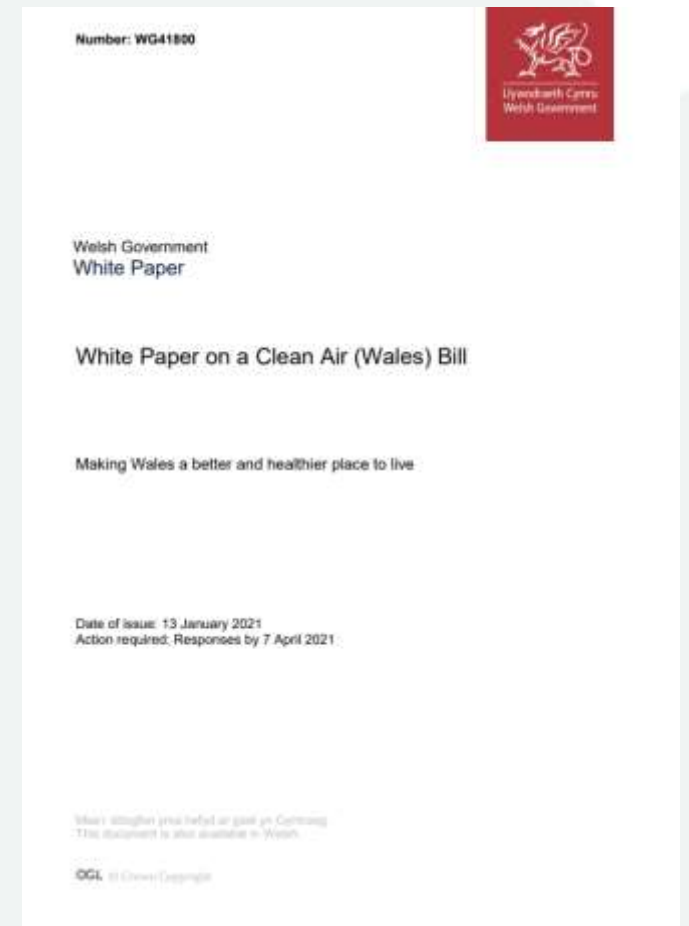
One year on...

- ✓ Develop a new transport strategy for Wales.
- ✓ Introduced Water Resources (Control of Agricultural Pollution) (Wales) Regulations 2021 to reduce ammonia emissions.
- ✓ Consult on a White Paper for a Clean Air Act (Wales).
- ✓ Consult on proposals to reduce emissions from domestic burning.



Clean Air (Wales) Bill

- With provisions on future clean air strategy timescales, target setting framework, road-user charging, local air quality management, smoke control and anti-idling.
- Key issues and questions still to address. For example, air quality funding.
- Ongoing input from key stakeholders, including the Clean Air Advisory Panel and sub-groups.



Tackling roadside nitrogen dioxide concentrations



- Strategic Road Network - fixed 50mph speed limit supported by average speed cameras:-
 - M4 Newport (J25-6) and Port Talbot (J41-2)
 - A470 Pontypridd – Upper Boat
 - A494 Deeside
 - A483 Wrexham
- Caerphilly, A472 Hafodyrynys – Demolition of row of houses to support improved dispersion of emissions.
- Cardiff, A4161 Castle Street – Package of clean air measures supporting reduced public transport emissions, and improved active travel connections.
